

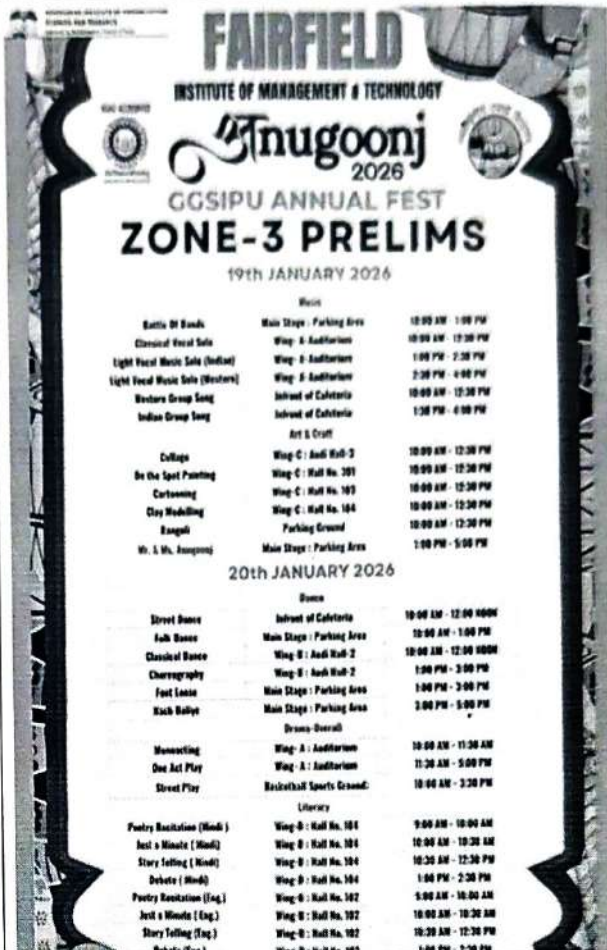

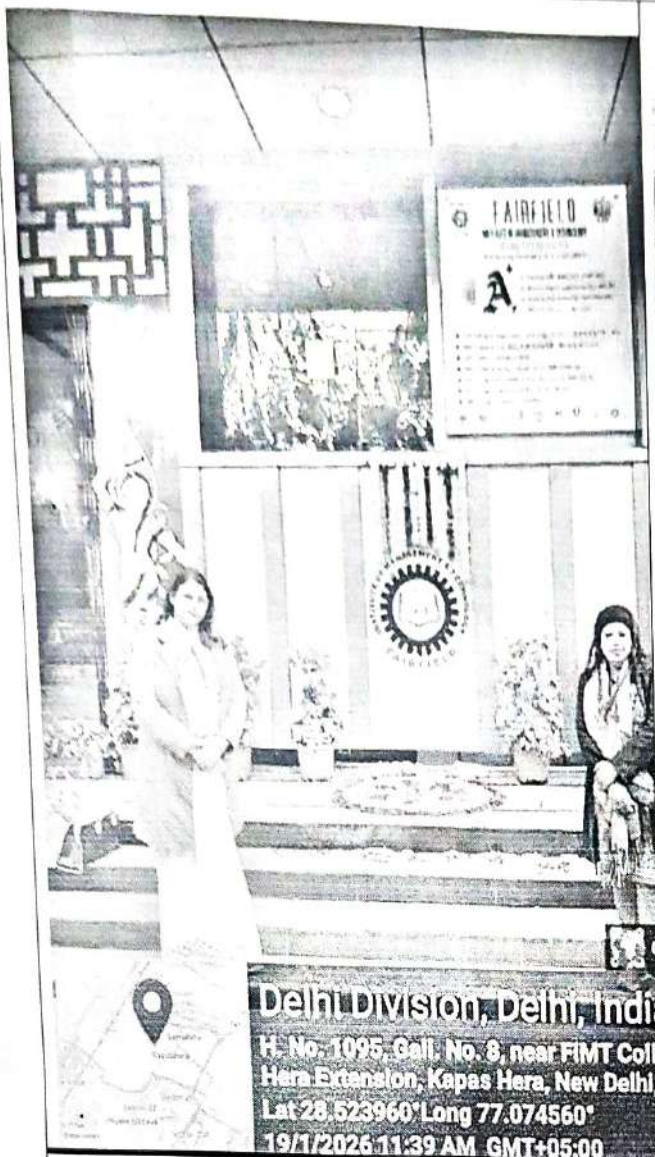
Title of Activity*	Echoes of Social Awareness

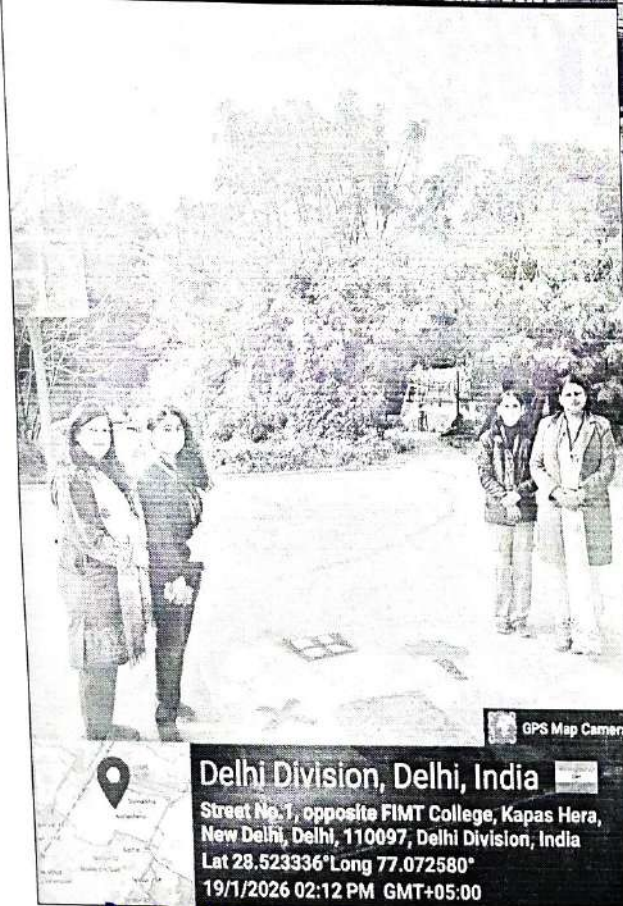
