

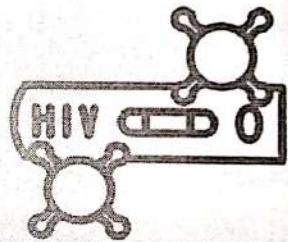
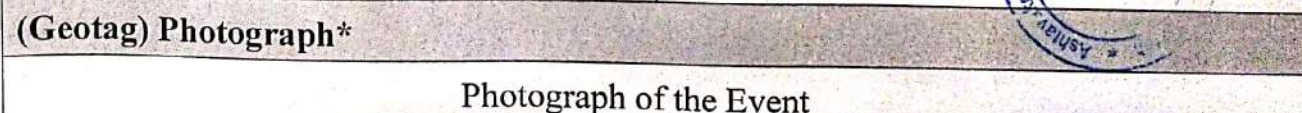

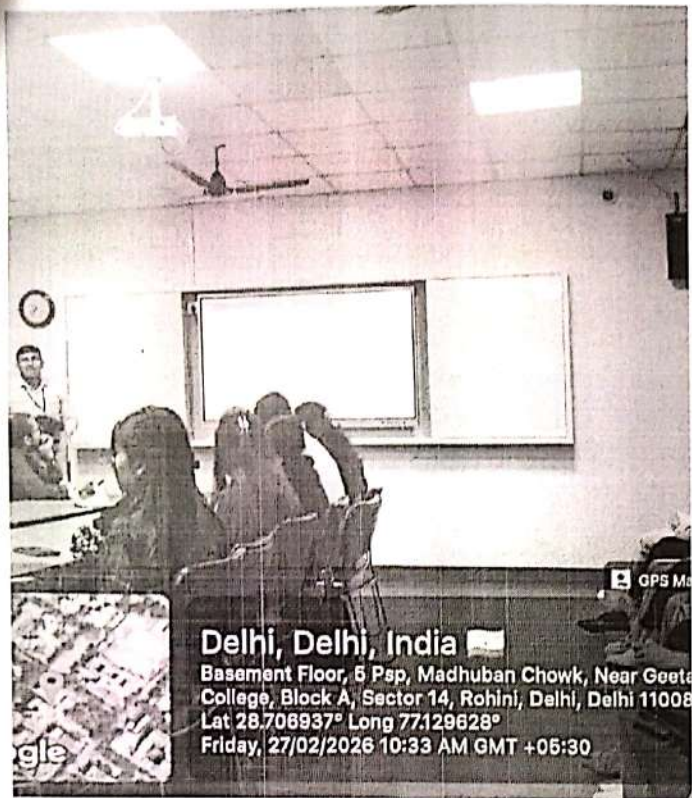

Report description: -

The session was addressed by **Mr. Tarun Pataanjali**, Faculty (ID Dept.), who guided the students on various important aspects of HIV/AIDS, its prevention, and the national scenario in India.

The session began with a basic introduction to HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) and AIDS (Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome). Students were made aware of the difference between HIV and AIDS, the modes of transmission, myths and misconceptions, and preventive strategies. Emphasis was laid on safe practices, early testing, awareness during pregnancy, and the importance of Antiretroviral Therapy (ART).

Mr. Tarun Pataanjali further discussed real case-based situations to enhance students' practical understanding. The discussion was supported by insights from the **India HIV Estimation Report 2025** under the National AIDS & STD Control Programme.

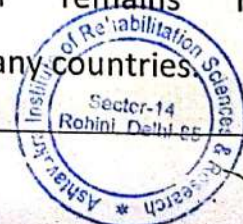


Key highlights included:

- Estimated number of People Living with HIV (PLHIV) in India
- State-wise prevalence trends
- Factors contributing to transmission
- Importance of early detection and treatment
- Government initiatives for prevention and control

During the session, statistical insights from the **India HIV Estimation Report 2025** under the National AIDS & STD Control Programme were discussed. Key statistical highlights shared with students included:

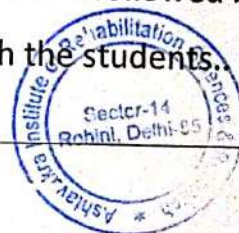
- India has an estimated **25.61 lakh People Living with HIV (PLHIV)**.
- The **adult HIV prevalence rate** in India is approximately **0.20%–0.21%**, which remains low compared to many countries.



- Around **63,000 new HIV infections** are estimated annually.
- Approximately **42,000 AIDS-related deaths** are reported annually.
- A significant proportion of PLHIV are in the **15–49 years age group**, which is the most economically productive population.
- Certain states show relatively higher prevalence, including regions in the North-East and some southern states.

The students actively participated in the discussion and raised questions regarding stigma, discrimination, mother-to-child transmission, and community-based rehabilitation support for persons living with HIV.

The session concluded with a summary of key points and a motivational message encouraging students to act as awareness ambassadors in society. The program ended with a vote of thanks followed by a group photograph with the students.
